Lunch boxes

We are continuing to work on the Healthy Heart Award at York Place. The children enjoy the many baking experiences and trying different foods. We encourage healthy choices to be provided in lunch boxes, with plenty of fruit, veges and sandwiches, and aiming to keep treats and packaged items to a minimum. A favourite recipie at present is fruit muffins. These can be made up in a batch and pulled out of the freezer one at a time for lunchboxes.

Cinnamon and Apple Muffins Ingredients: 2 cups flour 4 tsp baking powder 1tsp cinnamon ¼ cup sugar 100g melted butter 2 eggs 1 cup milk 3-4 apples, grated or diced

Method:

Sift flour, baking powder and cinnamon into a mixing bowl. Stir in sugar. Beat eggs and milk together. Pour liquid mixture, melted butter and apples into dry ingredients. Gently stir until just combined. Spoon into muffin tin. Cook for 15-20 mins at 200'. Cool on wire rack. Makes 12.



Wet Weather

Reminder to bring clothing suitable for the weather. Waterproof jackets, gumboots and a

Tui

The nursery tamariki have been exploring Ako/quality connections. We have been continuing to make connections and build loving relationships with new children and their whānau. Through positive interactions and guidance we have been encouraging social awareness, laying the foundations and role modelling empathy and love. Tamariki have been exploring their sense of independence and responsibility, being active participants in the daily life in the nursery and learning self-help skills e.g putting away dishes, sweeping, gardening, washing hands and faces and caring for themselves, others and the environment.

This week is sign language week. This is something that we regularly use with the children in the nursery to support them in their communication before, and as they develop their verbal language.









Pukeko

The preschool class have been enjoying outings in the community. This week a group are going to the Teddy Bear Hospital run by the University Medical and Dentistry Students. Recently they visited Toitu as well as the South Care Rest Home & Hospital and made some friends with the residents there.

Our next 5 week block course of Jump Rope begins this week. We have students from the Polytech visit twice a week to play some active games with the tamariki. This encourages working as a group and growing confidence.

The tamariki are building their independence, learning how to put on their own jackets, shoes and putting away their belongings. An interest in dramatic role play has been present around holidays and camping and they worked together to build a fort to eat their afternoon tea in.
