### **Learning focus**

In the nursery we have had the group focus on Mana Reo - Communication. Our tamariki have been becoming increasingly capable and confident as they develop their communication skills. These skills range from communicating cues via body language to learning how to express ideas, needs and wants with sign language and verbal communication. We have been exploring this throughout our everyday experiences such as routines, reading, observing vehicles outside and bugs in the garden. As well as these we have offered exciting provocations which spark the children's interests and offer the opportunity to extend communication skills as we play alongside each other e.g as we put up our Christmas tree many tamariki exclaimed, "Wooooow!" in excitement!







Our preschool current group focus has also been on communication where kaiako have been supporting and encouraging positive nonverbal and verbal communication throughout the day. We have been mirroring ways for tamariki to verbalise their wants in a way that communicates exactly what they are wanting. E.g. Instead of just "I'm thirsty" - "I am thirsty, can I have some water please."

Part of this focus has been on following instructions where fun, interactive games and baking have helped scaffold these important skills for all our Preschool tamariki.
