#### Whānau Picnic

#### **Tui Class**

In the nursery our current focus is "self expression" where we have been providing experiences for our tamariki to discover different ways to be creative and expressive. These have included experiences such as sensory exploration, music and movement, literacy - reading many books and dramatic play. We have observed so much incredible self expression emerging, ka rawe tamariki!





#### **Pukeko Class**

Tamariki in the Pukeko class have been enjoying lots of scientific and sensory exploration. 'Potions' are a favourite of the tamariki as they explore different substances such as corn flour, vinegar and baking soda among other things. They have been using pipettes and popsicle sticks for transferring substances between containers and mixing them together. Tamariki are amazed when a reaction happens, such as when the baking soda reacts with the vinegar and fizzes! As these are popular experiences, tamariki have been putting their wonderful social skills to use by communicating with their peers about sharing resources and negotiating space.

Recently we have also added in a couple of small hui times (group times) during the day before morning tea and lunch. Tamariki have been really enjoying engaging in different stories, musical experiences, finger plays and magnetic stories during this time. Tamariki have also been revisiting what to do in the event of an earthquake through the 'Turtle Safe' video (available on you tube) put out by Civil Defence. They really enjoyed listening to Stan the dog who showed us how to be safe under a table or tuck up like a turtle.
