Learning Focus

During our latest group planning cycle in the Nursery we have discovered a very strong group interest in transport. This interest has been evident with tamariki repeatedly engaging with vehicles. We have extended on this interest by increasing our range of vehicle resources to offer many different types and styles of vehicle, tracks and ramps as well as incorporating this into other areas such as literacy and mathematics by providing vehicle themed books and puzzles. We have been getting creative by making our own bus, police car and fire engine out of boxes and attaching them to the back of the bikes. Tamariki have been enjoying biking around with these as their trailers, filling them up and enjoying the challenge of navigating the environment. We are excited to see where this interest takes our learning next!





In the Pūkeko class, we are lucky to welcome Luke, Vincent and Sudha who are physical education students from Otago Polytechnic from the Hari Manawa programme. This programme will run for half an hour on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons during term 2, focusing on building, developing and refining foundational gross motor skills. This programme is predominantly aimed for our older Preschool tamariki, however our younger ones have enjoyed joining in as well! To begin with, tamariki have been focusing on balancing, with our students setting up challenge courses for them. Tamariki have been balancing along a rope, through cones and across balance beams! They have also been playing games such a 'green light, red light' and 'duck, duck goose' to



promote listening, working together and following instructions while being physically active. The tamariki are very excited and eager for their visits, we cannot wait to see what other exciting things are introduced to us through the Hari Manawa programme!
