Learning focus

We've been enjoying lots of messy fun in the Nursery lately with lots of sensory exploration! We really value messy play as this supports children's learning as they discover the world through touch, sight, smell, taste and

sound. One of our favourites is cornflour gloop which is a quick and easy taste safe option. This slime is fascinating to explore as when you apply pressure it feels hard, e.g rolling it into a ball. Then when you remove pressure, it turns back into liquid.

Cornflour gloop recipe

Ingredients

2 Cup Cornflour
1 Cup Cold Water

Method

Mix together in bowl
Add colour if desired



With the weather warming up we have been having lots of water play in the Preschool! Tamariki have been exploring foundational



mathematical concepts as they tip, pour and fill containers with water, such as volume and cause and effect. Water play is an amazing way to cool down on a hot day and is also a wonderful sensory tool for self-regulation.

A friendly reminder to please ensure your child has a wet bag and plenty of changes of clothes as we head into the warmer months as there will be lots more water play to be enjoyed!
